"UNBROKEN FORCE" of the Abrahamic Covenant

The God of scripture specifically singled out only one group of people to whom He committed himself in the form of 60 promises.

"UNBROKEN FORCE" of the Abrahamic Covenant

The God of scripture made this commitment to withhold nothing beneficial from this one group:

"Abraham and his seed".

"UNBROKEN FORCE" of the Abrahamic Covenant

■ Time frame: continue forever

- "UNBROKEN FORCE" of the Abrahamic Covenant
- promise 35:
- ....the covenant between God, Abraham, and his seed in their generations coming after Abraham is an everlasting covenant.
- Genesis 17:7 (NKJV) And I will establish My covenant between Me and you and your descendants after you throughout their generations for an everlasting, solemn pledge, to be a God to you and to your posterity after you.

- "UNBROKEN FORCE" of the Abrahamic Covenant
- promise 49 re-affirms this:
- ... with Isaac's seed after him for an everlasting covenant.
- Genesis 17:19 (NKJV) But God said, Sarah your wife shall bear you a son indeed, and you shall call his name Isaac [laughter]; and I will establish My covenant or solemn pledge with him for an everlasting covenant and with his posterity after him.

- "UNBROKEN FORCE" of the Abrahamic Covenant
- God never canceled His "forever".
- The term "forever" encompasses ALL of The Scriptures, The B'rit Hadasha (Gospels, Epistles, and Revelation), as well as The Tanakh (Torah, Prophets and Writings).
- The Abrahamic Seed Group is still in existence in the The B'rit Hadasha (Gospels, Epistles, and Revelation), era!

"UNBROKEN FORCE" of the Abrahamic Covenant

No theological system can be relied upon which fails to give these concepts above their proper place!!

- "UNBROKEN FORCE" of the Abrahamic Covenant
- "UNBROKEN FORCE" of the Abrahamic Covenant
- Paul's references from the The B'rit Hadasha (Gospels, Epistles, and Revelation), demonstrate the Abrahamic Covenant blessings continue in full force after the time of The Crucifixion of Christ.

- "UNBROKEN FORCE" of the Abrahamic Covenant
- Example from Gal 3:15
- The Apostle Paul does so by comparing the covenant made between God and Abraham with a covenant made between men.

- "UNBROKEN FORCE" of the Abrahamic Covenant
- (Galatians 3:15) "Brethren, I speak after the manner of men; though it be but a man's covenant, yet if it be CONFIRMED, no man disannulleth or addeth thereto".
- When two men make a covenant and confirm it, both men must agree to add another stipulation to the covenant or cancel the covenant entirely. One of the men would not have the right, unilaterally, to either add to the covenant or to cancel it without the express permission of the other man.

- "UNBROKEN FORCE" of the Abrahamic Covenant
- Once the covenant has been authorized by them both, any change in the terms or the duration of the covenant must also be agreed to by **both** men.
- Since Abraham is dead and cannot agree to any such rearrangement,
- Since there is no Scripture in either the Old or the New Testaments which record any such rearrangement or cancellation between God and Abraham,
- Conclusion of Galatians 3:15: Paul doesn't belabor the point:
- The Abrahamic Covenant continues in force during the Christian era.

- "UNBROKEN FORCE" of the Abrahamic Covenant
- In addition, in Galatians 3:17, Paul maintains that no third party can rearrange the terms or the duration of the covenant between God and Abraham. This includes Moses.
- Moses appeared with the Law over four hundred years later.
- Moses brought in the Law and placed it in conjunction with the Sixty Promises, Moses' Law did not change the Abrahamic Covenant one bit.
- Galatians 3:17 screams this tremendous, staggering truth. For Paul takes dead aim at the law and boldly declares that its appearance, four hundred thirty years after the confirmation of the Abrahamic Covenant, neither unauthorized the Abrahamic Covenant nor made it inoperative.

- "UNBROKEN FORCE" of the Abrahamic Covenant
- Paul said in (Galatians 3:17) "And this I say, that the covenant, that was confirmed before of God in Christ, the law, (Instructions), which was four hundred and thirty years after, cannot disannul, that it should make the promise of none effect"
- Four things to note in Galatians 3:17:
- 1. "the promise", or "the promises", is another term used in the N.T. for the Abrahamic Covenant. (See previous presentation)
- 2. "Confirmed"
- 3. "cannot disannul"
- 4. "none effect"

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- Nr 2. "Confirmed" in this verse (Galatians 3:17), combines the Greek preposition PRO, meaning "previously," and KURAO (the same word translated "confirmed" in verse 15), meaning "to authorize."
- PRO + KURAO = "previously authorized".
- This combination, then, means "previously confirmed or authorized."
- The covenant between God and Abraham was authorized prior to the Law.

- "UNBROKEN FORCE" of the Abrahamic Covenant
- Nr 3. "cannot disannul " Therefore, no third party has the right to set aside, rearrange, or unauthorize this covenant.
- This includes the Law of Moses since it was not an original provision of the covenant.
- The "Law of Moses" came into being four hundredthirty years later.

- "UNBROKEN FORCE" of the Abrahamic Covenant
- In other words to reemphasize this fact:
- Since there are no Scriptures that state the Abrahamic Covenant has been set aside, rearranged, or unauthorized:
- no other third party (preacher, teacher, writer, theologian, Moses, or anyone else) can sensibly, credibly, or scripturally maintain otherwise.

- "UNBROKEN FORCE" of the Abrahamic Covenant
- Nr. 4. "none effect"
- "Of none effect" is the translation of KATARGEO.
- KATA = "down" and ARGOS = "not working," "inactive," or "inoperative."
- ARGOS = A (Greek negative) + ERGON = "work" ARGOS = "negation of work, absence of work, no work."
- KATARGEO = "reduced in status or rank to a position of no longer working or being active."
- KATARGEO is used to demonstrate, not that something has disappeared, but that something has lost its purpose, its reason for being, and has therefore become useless, no longer functioning as originally intended.

- "UNBROKEN FORCE" of the Abrahamic Covenant
- Nr. 4. continued: "none effect"
- Now his use of KATARGEO thunders out: The Law did not reduce the Abrahamic Covenant in status, rank, or importance.
- Neither did The Law place the PROMISE in the position of no longer working, no longer being active, or making it of none effect.
- The covenant is still confirmed, in force, active, and working for the benefit of the Abrahamic Seed Group.

- "UNBROKEN FORCE" of the Abrahamic Covenant
- Galatians 3:17 (once more Paul's words)
- "And this I say, that the covenant, that was confirmed before of God in Christ, the law, (Instructions), which was four hundred and thirty years after, cannot disannul, that it should make the promise of none effect".

- "UNBROKEN FORCE" of the Abrahamic Covenant
- Paul's view SUMMARIZED; the continuing force of the Abrahamic Covenant during the Christian era:
- 1. The Abrahamic Covenant was confirmed in the past (PRO plus KURAO). (Galatians 3:17)
- 2. The results of that authorization were still standing in Paul's day (Greek Perfect Tense).
- 3. Neither God nor Abraham rearranged the Terms or duration of it (EPIDIATASSO).
- 4. Neither God nor Abraham canceled it (ATHETEO).

- "UNBROKEN FORCE" of the Abrahamic Covenant
- 5. Since Abraham died and can no longer agree to any changes or cancellations, not even God himself can unilaterally rearrange or cancel it!
- 6. No third party can place any additional stipulations upon it that would rearrange its terms or duration.
- 7. No third party (not even Moses) can "undo the confirmation" of it (AKURAO).
- 8. No third party can declare the Abrahamic Covenant "to be inoperative" (KATARGEO).
